President's Report

Dear Colleagues,

I am writing to you for two reasons. The first is to give you an update and recap from our winter board meeting, and the second is to welcome you to our Spring Meeting.

The Board of Directors held its Winter Board meeting virtually on January 9, 2025. We reviewed our Miami Annual Meeting statistics: 304 abstract submissions, including 220 poster presentations, and our highest attendance ever at any meeting. This is a trend that is likely to continue. We jointly signed a position statement on Empty Nose Syndrome with the AAOHNS and the AAOA, and this position statement is now available on our website for viewing. Our international collaborations continue to be strong, having initiated outreach with African Rhinologists and initiating/ renewing MOUs with the Thai Rhinologic Society and the All India Rhinologic Society. Many thanks to Drs. Do-Yeon Cho, Jivianne Lee, and Devyani Lal for spearheading these efforts. Dr. Pete Batra led the search for the new EVP, and we have recently announced that Dr. Brent Senior will succeed Dr. Michael Stewart in October 2025. Dr. Stewart has been a tremendous force for positive change within the ARS, and on behalf of the Executive Committee, I thank him for his years of service.

Content has been updated to meet readability requirements and emphasize links to other highquality websites, and committee members are collaborating with Clinician Box to further update and improve the site. We envision a growing library of educational and multimedia content aimed not only at patients but also at non-ENT physicians and associated providers, with the goal of becoming the go-to source for rhinology information on the internet.


